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## Well-being Conversations 2026

This toolkit provides a simple structure to support important conversations around the well-being of Gwynedd and Anglesey today, and what needs to be done to safeguard or improve the well-being of future generations.

Participants are welcome to discuss the questions below as part of a group, within existing meetings (such as community forums partner, association, council or team meetings, etc.), or to submit your own thoughts on the questions provided below.

**Where this activity is undertaken as part of a group, participants are asked to be respectful of one another and to recognise that people may hold different views and experiences. Everyone should be given the opportunity to contribute, and discussions should be conducted in a constructive, inclusive and considerate way.**

# 1. Introduction

## Why get involved?

You are being invited to support a conversation about the well-being of Gwynedd and Anglesey— what is working well now, the challenges we face, and what we want life to look like for future generations. Your experiences, insights and aspirations matter, because they help build a shared understanding of the real issues affecting people and communities across the area.

## What is this information for?

Gwynedd and Anglesey have a joint Public Services Board (PSB) in place to oversee the well-being of both counties. These conversations will help inform the PSB's local Well-being Assessment, which it is a requirement under the Well-being of Future Generations (Wales) Act 2015. The Well-being Assessment brings together evidence, data and local voices to understand the social, economic, environmental and cultural well-being of the area, both now and in the long term. It looks at how different factors are connected, where inequalities exist, and what the key risks and opportunities are for the future.

## What is the benefit?

The information gathered through this engagement will be combined with other information and up to date data to shape the Well-being Assessment, which in turn will be used by the PSB to set well-being objectives. These objectives guide how \*public organisations work together to improve outcomes for people, communities and the environment, and to ensure decisions made today help create a better future for generations to come. Your contribution helps ensure these objectives are grounded in lived experience and reflect what really matters to the people who live and work here.

Even though this is a survey across both counties, the information will be prepared based on 22 well-being areas, with the hope that you will recognise your area in the completed assessments. **We'd appreciate it if you could include your full postcode when responding so we can identify which well-being area you live in, and so your response can be included in the well-being assessment for the correct area. It won't be used to identify you.**
