About this conversation

We want to hear from children and young people about what it's like to grow up and live in Gwynedd or Anglesey— what's good, what's difficult, and what needs to change.

What you tell us will help shape the Well-being Assessment and influence the decisions made by *public organisations that are part of the Gwynedd and Anglesey Public Services Board. Your views matter – this is your chance to help shape the future.

Why should I get involved?

Your experiences help adults understand what life is really like for young people today. What you tell us will help improve a range of public services and makes sure future plans work for young people, not just adults.

The Big Questions

1. What's good about living in your area?

For example: What makes life good for young people? What and where do you enjoy? What works well? What opportunities are available to you?

2. What would you like to see happen in the future?

For example: Think about your future or the future of a child born today. What would you like to see? What needs to change?

3. What makes life harder for young people in your area?

What doesn't work well? What opportunities aren't available to you? What feels unfair?

4. What are the main things that need to change and how will we know that things have got better?

What would make the biggest difference? Which public organisations need to help?

How can young people take part?

You can write answers, talk as a group, draw pictures or mind maps, use post-it notes, or vote on ideas. Adults supporting sessions should listen, avoid judgement and record views in young people's own words.
